During the evening, Judy LeRoy, also gave an excellent slide presentation.

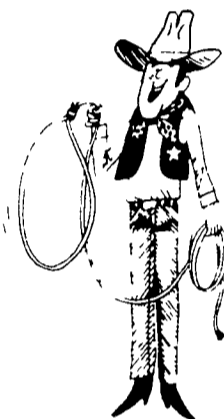
The slides described the nine day pack trip she and her daughter took through Wyoming.

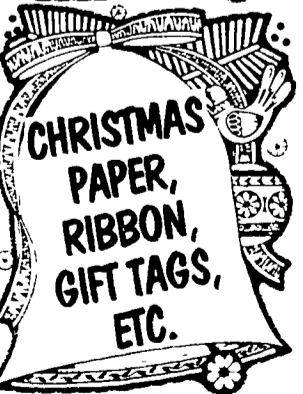
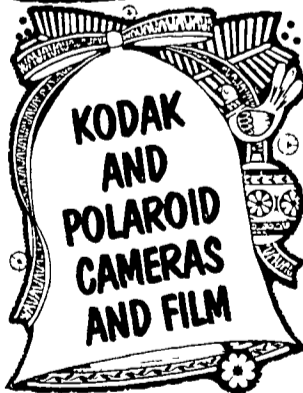
