McCammon is active in Bedford County 4-H activities and is president of the Pennsylvania Southdown Association.

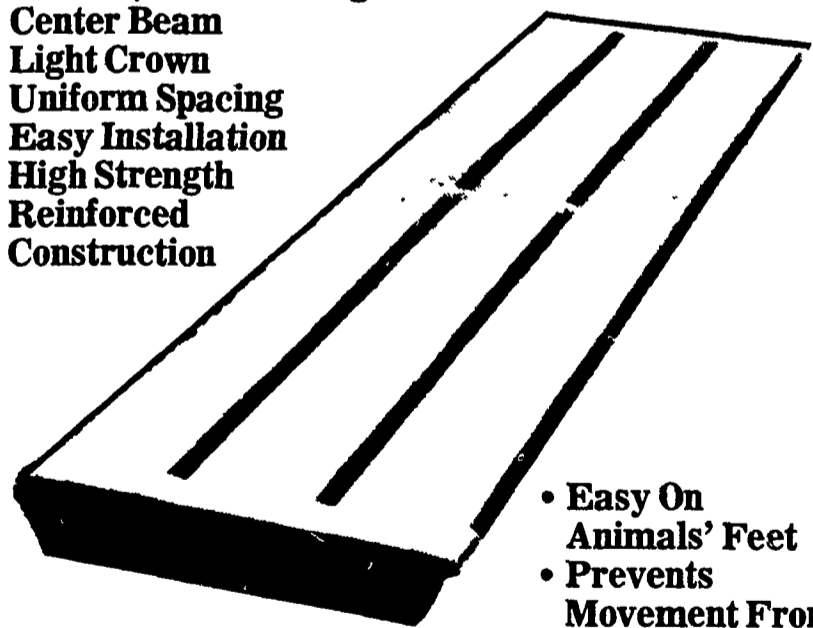
He is married to the former Ida Barr, of Mt. Pleasant. They are the parents of three children.
