mid-week. Yield Grade 4 cattle continue under pressure.

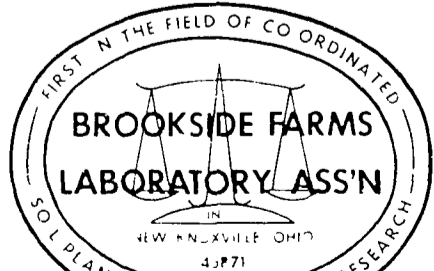
