The meeting will be held January 4, 1980 at Schundler's Restaurant, on 21st street, just west of Rt 11 and 15 in Camp Hill.


Drinks will be served at 6 p.m. with dinner starting at 7 p.m.

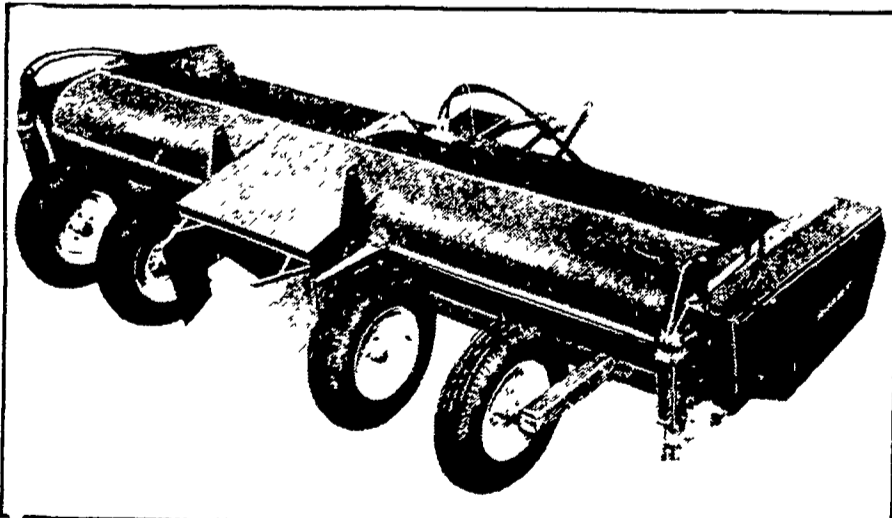
