DOVER, Del. - Sixty 4-H leaders and junior leaders from throughout the state recently participated in a craft training workshop held at the Capitol Grange in Dover.


The purpose of the workshop was to allow leaders to learn how to make inexpensive crafts that could be taught to 4-H'ers during their monthly meetings.
