Mrs. Romaine Trout and Mrs. Helena Stoner will serve as delegates to the state convention in Harrisburg on January 7 and 8.

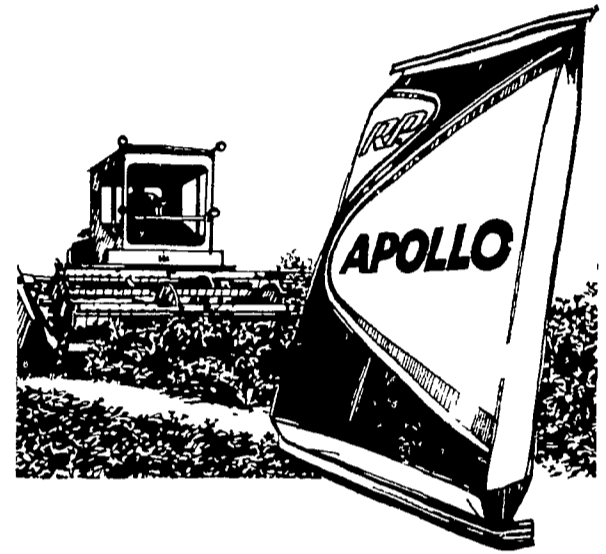
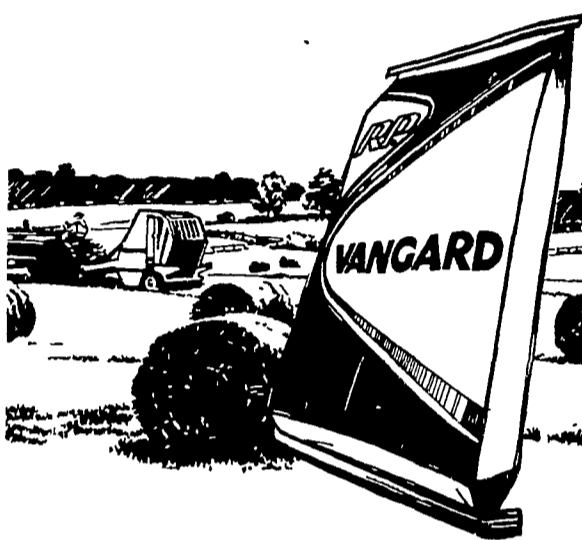
