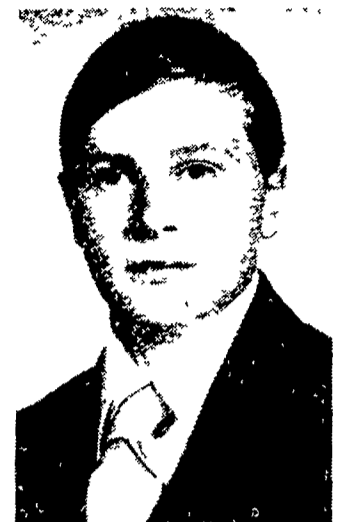
His FFA projects include dairy heifers, market hogs and corn, wheat and oats. Russ also served on the orange sales committee.
