In addition to poultry projects, Mike has main-



As the 17 year old son of James and Lorraine Shadle, Daniel Shadle has been nominated to receive the FFA Keystone Degree.


As a four year member of the Tri Valley FFA Chapter, Dan has had a variety of projects including pheasants, potatoes, and Christmas trees.
