to Maple Lodge for only the past few years.

Practically all of the growers are independent producers, and the Canadian buyer had been a good market for a number of poultrymen who might otherwise have had a difficult time of placing their birds.

"We're still selling to

Maple Lodge," Day said, "and they're fairly confident they'll be able to continue buying. But they can't give us any guarantees, and we are looking for other markets.

"We've been able to find some buyers in New Jersey and in Pennsylvania, but we're taking a beating in the

price because we have to sell," he added.

The Montgomery-Bucks plight seems to begin and end with a Canada-wide monopoly by chicken producers.

Producers in Canada have been holding tightly onto the reins of their industry for a number of years through provincial organizations like the Ontario Chicken Producers Marketing Board.

All but two of the Canadian provinces have such boards, and they control pricing and output.

On October 21, the provincial boards coalesced into a nationwide organization. The national group apparently has a lot more muscle than the separate boards had.

Before the national board came into being, independent processors like Maple Lodge could get supplemental quotas allowing them to import chickens from the United States whenever Canadian product wasn't available, Day said.

The government-backed boards, both at the provincial and national levels, have imposed much more stringent quotas, Day noted, in a bid to raise prices.

Maple Lodge doesn't care if it pays 40-cents a pound for Canadian chicken or 28-cents a pound for U.S. chicken.

"When you figure out the hauling cost and the dollar differential — a Canadian

dollar is now worth about 85-cents U.S. — we're paying about the same either way for product," he said.

"We just can't get product," he added.

Day said the situation is difficult, even unbelievable.

"I can't understand why our government would sanction a very restrictive import quota without giving the industry some period of adjustment," he said. "And I can't understand why the U.S. government would just stand by and watch it happen."

Day said in the light of the fact Canadian birds weren't available, the denial of supplemental import quotas by the marketing board may be of questionable legality.

"We're going to be looking very closely at the legal implications," he said.

Day couldn't forecast any changes either way in the next few months.

"We have developed good relationships with our suppliers in the U.S. We're just caught in the middle right now, and we're going to do everything we can to keep our good relationships with those suppliers."
