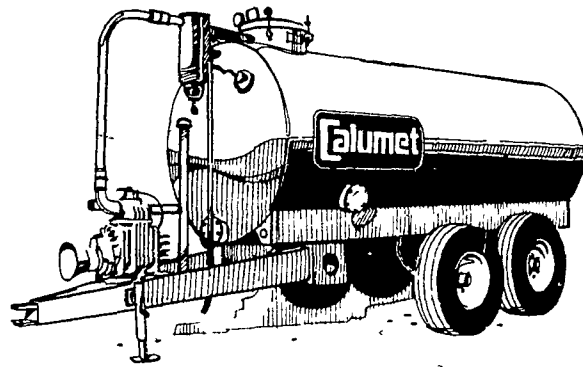
Fifty cows finished lactation records with 600 lbs of milkfat in November. The records are based on 305 days or less, 2x actual production.

Reich has had dairy heifers. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Reich.

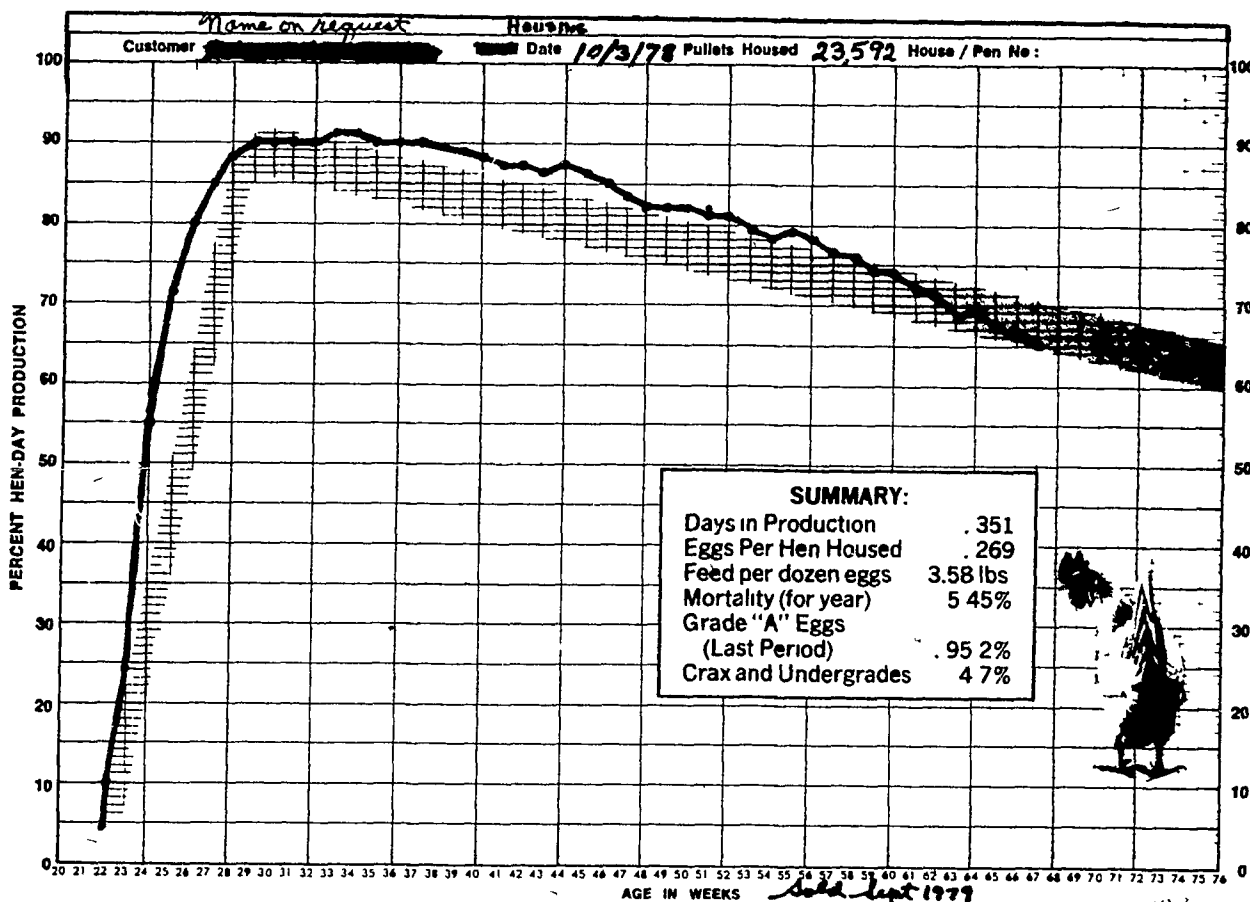
The Troxells are the sons of Mr. and Mrs. Larry Troxell. Randy's project has been breeding sheep while

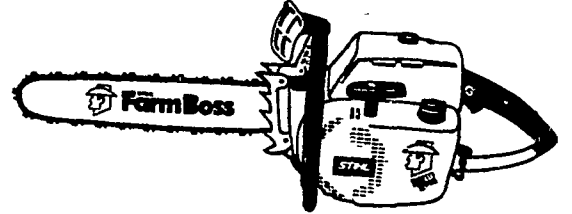
