## POTATO DOUGHNUTS

1½ cups sugar  
3 eggs  
2 cups mashed potatoes  
1 cup sweet milk  
5 teaspoons baking powder  
5 cups flour  
3 tablespoons melted shortening  
1 teaspoon salt  
¼ teaspoon nutmeg  
Beat mashed potatoes, add melted fat, beaten eggs and milk. Sift dry ingredients together and add to liquid. Dough should be soft yet firm enough to roll. Divide dough in four parts. Roll out one part at a time to ¼ inch thickness. Cut with doughnut cutter and drop into deep fat at 375 degrees F. Fry until a golden brown on both sides. Drain on absorbent paper. Shake in a paper bag containing a mixture of sugar and cinnamon or powdered sugar.  
Yield: 4½ dozen doughnuts,

## QUICK POTATO DOUGHNUTS

Instant puff potatoes, enough for 2 servings  
3 eggs  
¾ cup granulated sugar  
2 teaspoons vanilla  
2¾ cups flour  
4 teaspoons baking powder  
1 teaspoon salt  
¼ teaspoon nutmeg  
¼ teaspoon cinnamon  
Prepare instant puffs as directed on package for two servings except omit butter and salt. Add eggs, sugar, shortening and vanilla; beat thoroughly. Stir in flour, baking powder, salt, nutmeg and cinnamon. Turn onto generously floured board; knead about 10 times. Roll dough ½ inch thick. Let rest 20 minutes. In deep fat fryer, heat fat or oil to 375 to 380 degrees F. Cut dough with floured doughnut cutter. Fry doughnuts until brown; drain. Serve frosted, glazed or sprinkled with sugar.  
Yield: 1½ dozen doughnuts.

## FILLED DOUGHNUTS

2 packages yeast  
1 cup lukewarm water  
1 teaspoon sugar  
1 cup milk, scalded and cooled  
½ cup shortening, part butter  
¾ cup granulated sugar  
1½ teaspoon salt  
2 whole eggs  
5 cups sifted flour  
Put first three ingredients in a small bowl and set aside. Mix milk and eggs, add yeast and mix well. Add ½ cup flour, sugar, salt, and shortening. Use enough flour to make a soft dough to be handled.

1 teaspoon vanilla  
2 tablespoons milk  
1 cup confectioners sugar  
¾ cup vegetable shortening  
Beat egg white, add remaining ingredients, mix well. Make a cut in doughnuts to put in filling.

# Pickles and maple syrup?

HARRISBURG — You may not think of dill pickles and maple syrup as particularly compatible taste treats. They're not.

That is one reason why horticulturists judging maple syrup entries at the 64th Farm Show use them.

A slice of pickle after a taste of maple syrup competely clears the palate, says maple syrup expert and Farm Show judge Ture Johnson.

The next sample can then be judged fairly.

Before the taste test, the syrup is judged for clarity. Judges should be able to read the print on a paper held behind the glass container by looking through the syrup. Color is important, too, and generally, lighter is better, notes Johnson.
