Delaware schedules land use meetings

DOVER, Del. — Two meetings — one for farmers and the other for non-farmers -- have been scheduled to explore the issue of agricultural land preservation in Delaware.

The farmer meeting will take place Thursday, January 31, at the Capitol Grange Hall in Dover.

The non-farmer meeting will be held Febuary 1 at the State Highway Department building across from the Blue Hen Mall in Dover. Both day-long sessions will begin at 9 a.m. and end at 4 p.m.

The purpose of these meetings is to provide owners and users of agricultural land with a broad overview of what is happening to Delaware's farmland and how these trends may affect them in the future, says Doug Angle, University of Delaware extension rural development agent.

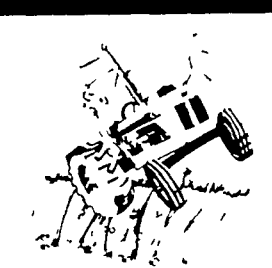
The program at both sessions will include a discussion of the issue of agricultural land preservation in the state, the

possible need for it, the pros and cons of preserving farmland, and a look at what other states are doing.

These meetings are sponsored by the Delaware Cooperative Extension Service. Another meeting is planned for early next spring, at which time both farmers and non-farmers will be able to get together to further explore the subject of farmland preservation in Delaware.

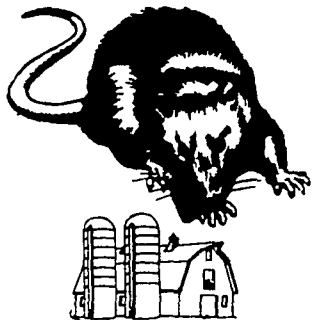

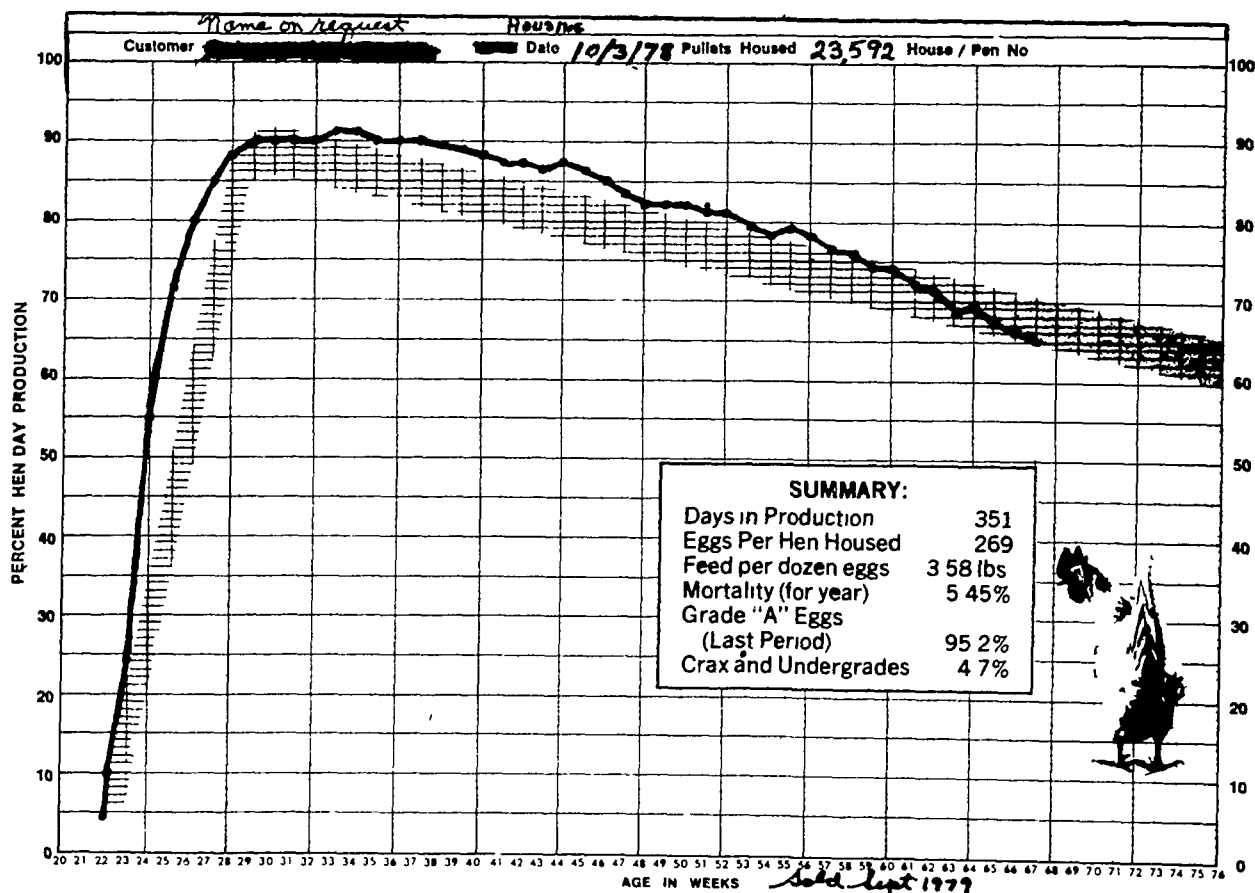
