

Ayrshire awards

HARRISBURG — William C. Henley of Cochranville, Chester County, captured the grand and senior championships in open class Ayrshire judging competition at the 64th Farm Show with "Towerview Kelly's Heather," a 5-year-old.

Reserve grand and reserve senior champion was "Sycamore Meade Albi Carri," a 2-year-old exhibited by E. E. Keefer and Don Shetterly of Millersburg, Dauphin County.

Junior champion was "Towerview Star Cadrin," a senior yearling shown by Sharon Nolan, William Henley's married sister of Cochranville, Chester County.

"Cove Creek Boys Kate Kat," a senior yearling, won the reserve junior championship. The animal is owned by Joey Welsh of East Berlin, York County.

Towerview Farm, owned by the Kennard Henley Family of Cochranville, was both the premier exhibitor and premier breeder awards.

In youth competition, William Henley's five-year-old walked off with grand and senior championship honors.

Tiny Lona J. Rader, barely older than the 3-year-old "Homestead Acres Royal Lady", took reserve grand and reserve senior championships. Lona is from Connoquenessing, Butler County.

Sharon Nolan's senior yearling was the junior champion and Joey Welsh's senior yearling was reserve grand.

Pa. Polled Hereford queen

HARRISBURG — Tammy Hamilton travelled across the state to attend the Polled Hereford show at this year's Pa. Farm Show. She was slated to serve a major part in the show since she is this year's Pa. Polled Hereford Queen.

The petite blonde hails from North East, a town that actually lies along Lake Erie in northwestern Pennsylvania. The seventeen year old queen has served the state associations since last March.

During her reign, Hamilton has attended the national show in Louisville, Kentucky, field days, and parades as the P.H. representative for the state. She squeezes her cattle activities into her school schedule.

A senior at North East High School, Hamilton is the co-captain of the varsity cheerleading squad. She is also a member of the FFA where she serves as the chapter and county vice-president.

Besides representing the breed, the Polled Hereford queen owns eight head of the bold breed. She has shown her cattle at local fairs where she has won champion honors.

At the Waterford Fair, she showed the reserve champion bull. She took the same honor at the Watsburg Fair. During the Albion show, Hamilton's cattle stepped up into the grand champion circle with a grand bull and heifer.

In her breeding program, Hamilton is using two bulls from Spring Bottom Farm in Adams County, SBF Royal Marksman and SBF Royal

Leige. She is hoping to someday have a large herd and a farm of her own.

At the present time, Hamilton keeps her growing herd on her parents' 25 acre farm. Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. David Hamilton, have a commercial herd of cattle on the farm.

Because of her experience with the different breeds her parents keep, Hamilton has selected Polled Herefords are the breed she will raise. "Polled Herefords are

gentle," she said, "and the other cattle my parents have aren't as nice as mine."

Besides the cattle, the P.H. queen owns three horses, an Arabian, a Quarter Horse x Thoroughbred, and a large pony type.

After graduation, she plans to attend an equestrian school and then a secretarial school. During this time, she plans to continue raising and showing her favorite cattle, Polled Herefords.

washers were a higher risk than the fear of fire.

It was also pointed out that the large doors around the beef and sheep barns were blocked every day by cars and trucks belonging to employees and exhibitors. Itle stated that the Commission would work to keep employees or any one else from parking in front of the doors because of the fire hazard involved.

Frank Darcey, president of the Polled Hereford Association in Pennsylvania, told the 56 people attending the exhibitors banquet there are always two sides to every story, the exhibitors' and managements' viewpoints. Hopefully the first meeting between the Polled Hereford people and the Farm Show management has led to constructive solutions to problems.

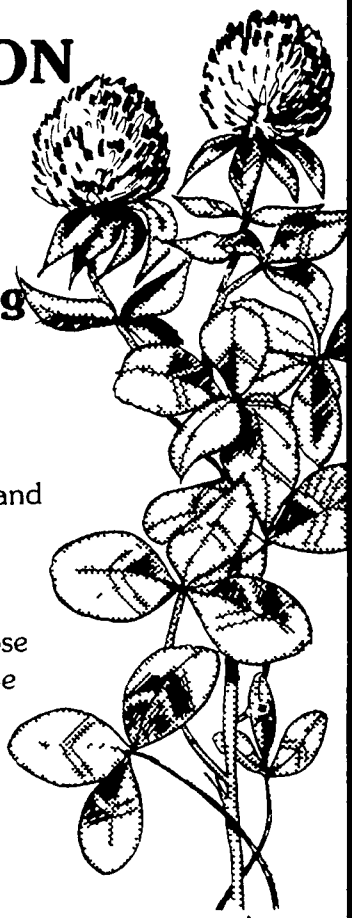
