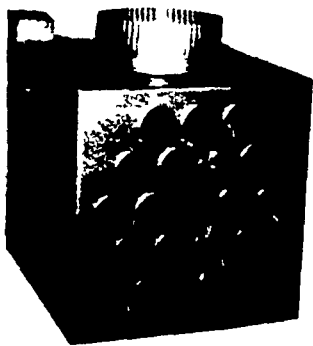
The State Suffolk Queen, Charlotte Myers, presented a plaque to Sarah Brubaker, the light heavyweight champion.

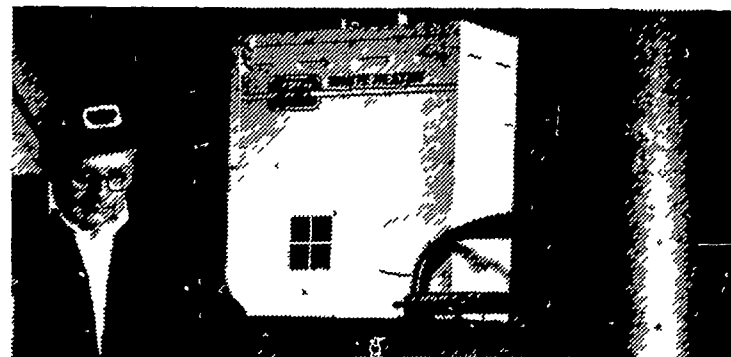

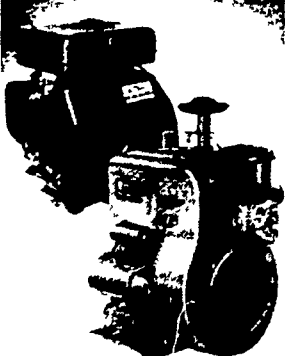
