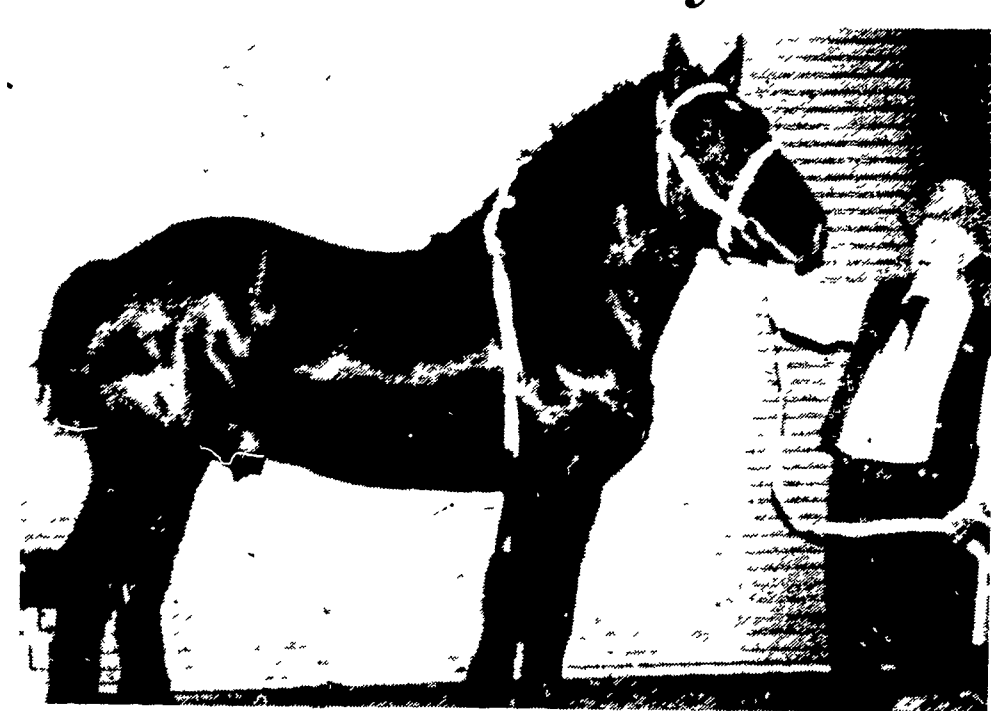

an event like the Farm Show is almost as good as a blank check. "If our supreme champion cow here has a heifer calf, and if we can't get \$5,000 for the calf, then we'll keep her in the herd," Perry said.

And the champion herself can be bought. "All the cows in our herd are for sale...for a price," Perry said.

Like most exhibitors, Perry said they don't expect to show a profit in the show ring, but they do hope to earn enough premium money to cover their expenses. That

includes room, board, meals and the services of a young man named Carl Thayer, an artist with clippers and brushes who got the animals fitted for showing. Thayer is a milk tester from Thurmont, Maryland.

There are 20 Guernseys in the Grand View herd and 40 Holsteins. At any one time, 50 of those cows are milking. They won't be raising replacements as a rule, Perry said, because they'll be trying to sell the young animals as quickly as they can.

recreation to hundreds of local folks. The thickness of the ice is an important factor before allowing anyone to skate. Our recreation experts inform us that ice should be at least 2 inches thick to hold an average man, 3 inches thick to hold a group of people, and at least 8 inches thick to hold a car. I've known of folks who ran their car on the edge of the ice to give light for night skating. The ice was not

thick enough and the car went into the water. Spring fed ponds could be more dangerous because the water is warmer and the ice thinner at places where the springs feed water into the pond. Pond owners are urged to check ice thickness before permitting skating. Also, be sure to have rescue equipment, such as a wooden ladder or a rope, at the side of the pond. Stress farm pond safety at all times.
