This transportation will be provided for delegates, representatives and showmanship contestants, and educational stops will be made along the way.

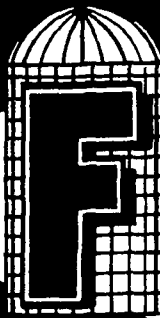
