Four day recipts this week 10,400, last week 13,800 a year ago 13,200.

The fed cattle trade followed an irregular course characterized by wide dayto-day price variations. Early trading was quite bearish and prices were forced sharply downward in reflection of a dull carcass trade. A part of the early decline was regained, however, in an aggressive midweek trade on curtailed supplies. Yield grade was again a dominant price determining factor, and even yield grade 3 800-900 lb. carcasses sold 2.00-3.00 per cwt below 600-800 lb. carcasses. In addition, mud was a more prevalent condition as feedlot conditions deteriorated. Much of the steer supply was good to average-Choice, with Steers making up approximately 48 pct of the supply and Heifers 29 pct. Cows comprised 15 pct. and Feeders 5 pct.


