 Compared to Tuesday's 4:30 report, Choice 3 steer beef 1.00-2.00, mostly 1.00 higher Choice 4 and Good steady. Heifer beef mostly steady to 1.00 higher in limited test. Afternoon trading at a near standstill except for weekly commitments to chain stores. Processor demand very light and most taking a wait and see attitude late. Boxed cuts did show good movement in the afternoon, but distribution of volume was uneven. Packers are bullish and report limited carcass supplies especially on light weights.
