# Pig feed supplement licensed

**SOMERVILLE, N.J.** — F.S. Services, Inc. of Bloomington, Ill., is the first major feed company to be licensed to include bambarmycins in its swine product line.

Stephen Bush, Swine Product Manager of the Feed Division of F.S. Services, said: "We've had several customers ask us for bambarmycins as part of our product line. It's an excellent finishing growth promotant and it's a clean antibiotic because there are no residues and no withdrawal period."

"Our own tests showed that bambarmycins gave the most economical return as

compared to other finishing feed additive programs," he stated.

Bambarmycins can be fed to hogs right up to the day of slaughter without a withdrawal period. An approved FD 1800 is not required when it is used as the only drug in complete rations.

Tests showed that, on the average, this product will save hog producers \$600.00 for every 500 hogs fed from 75 pounds to market, according to the manufacturer.

Record-high acreage and yields brought a 1979 U.S. soybean crop of 2.2 billion bushels, up 18 percent from 1978.

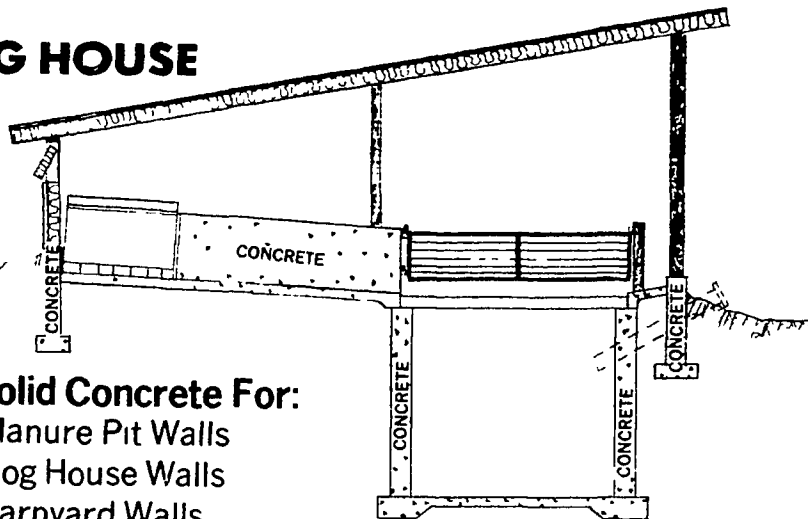
