The yield per colony during 1979 averaged 41 pounds per colony, up 10 pounds per colony from 1978, but the number of colones decluned 5 percent to 74,000 . Beeswax production for 1979 was 58,000 pounds, up 23 percent from 1978.
Sales of all honey in Pennsylvania in 1979 indicated that an average price of 64.3 cents per pound was received compared to 65.3 cents per pound in 1978.
