

# Production, marketing to highlight Delmarva meeting

OCEAN CITY, Md. — Soybean producers from Maryland, Delaware, New Jersey and Pennsylvania are invited to participate in the 14th Annual Delmarva Soybean Meeting held in conjunction with the Mid-Atlantic Soybean Association annual meeting

at Convention Hall in Ocean City on February 14.

Exhibits of products to aid in soybean production will be open when registration begins at 8:30 a.m.

Heading the list of speakers are Kenneth L. Bader, chief executive officers of the American

Soybean Association, and Dale Hathaway, undersecretary of agriculture for International Affairs and Commodity Development.

Other speakers include James Durphey of North Carolina State University, who will discuss soybean

row spacing and planting, interaction; and Lee Hellman of the University of Maryland and Henry Wilson of Virginia Truck and Ornamentals Research Station, who will speak on agricultural chemicals for weed and insect control.

Ron Jester of the University of Delaware and Gary Smith of the University of Maryland will team up to address the subject, "Watch Your LD50."

The Mid-Atlantic Soybean Association will hold a short business meeting chaired by Mid-Atlantic Soybean Association President William Bradley of Salisbury, Maryland, at 3:30 p.m. following the conference program.

## Forestry employment available to school seniors

LANCASTER — The opportunity to work in a National Forest, National Park, wildlife refuge or research laboratory is being offered high school seniors graduating in 1980, through an Izaak Walton league recruitment program to promote the interest of young people in conservation careers.

Applicants should be interested in a career in natural resources and conservation, have demonstrated potential for leadership and scholastic ability, must be in good health and, in most instances, physically capable of field work.

In addition, candidates must be high school seniors, expecting to graduate in 1980. The program requires that applicants be 18 years of age by June 15, 1980.

Students applying must submit the following material for consideration:

1. A completed U.S. Government Form 171, available from local Federal Job Information Centers listed in the telephone directory or call 800-555-1212 for the toll-free number of the nearest Center.

2. A transcript of high school record.

3. A written recommendation from an adult, other than family, who knows the applicant and his or her qualifications for the program.

4. A letter from the applicant indicating his or her college and career plans, activities in high school, previous conservation-oriented work (paid or volunteer), and reasons for seeking employment through the program.

Applications are being accepted by Izaak Walton League Divisions all across the country. Interested Lancaster County students should apply before

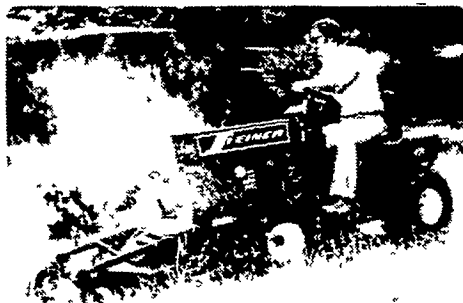

The program, which began in 1963, is presented in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Interior and the U.S. Forest Service.

In 1978, some 94 positions were filled by the program. Jobs offered students include employment as fire and brush crews, survey teams and lab assistants.

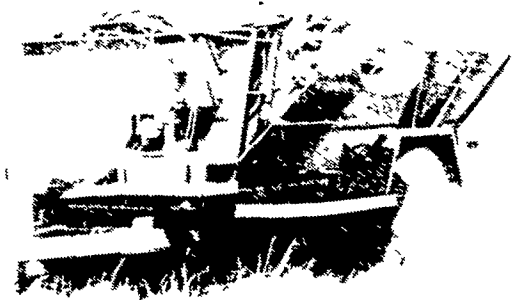

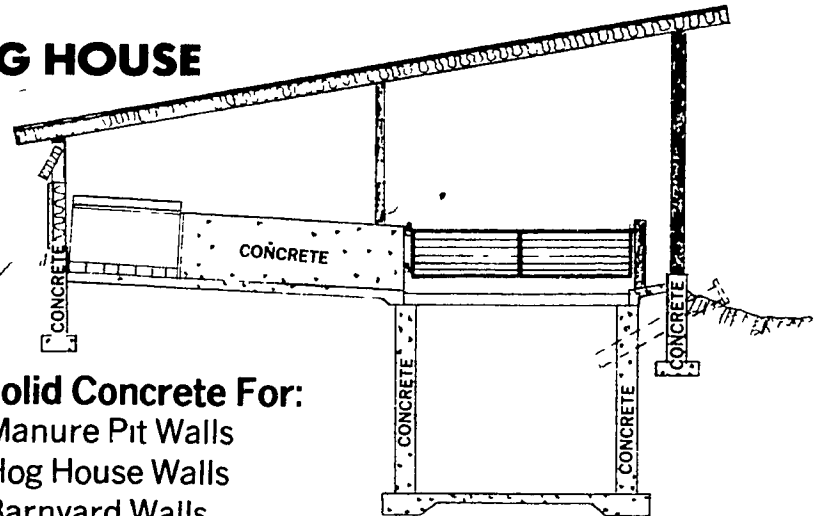
