

Handy booklet tells how to insulate

The rising cost of heating a farm home makes energy saving a must through home improvements with insulation, according to the Governor's Energy Council.

Knowing where to insulate and selecting the insulation to use are discussed in a free 26-page booklet, "Insulation Guide," available from the GEC.

The National Bureau of Standards reports that adequate insulation in the attic can save up to 30 percent on fuel bills. Summer savings for air-conditioning would be comparable.

There is a special section on how to insulate your home yourself with an explanation on figuring how much insulation will be needed to do a thorough job of both winterizing and summerizing the home.

A list of do's and don't's for the do-it-yourself farm owner can act as a guide to insulating safely.

In regions of the country where snows lie on the ground all winter, the National Bureau of Standards estimates that installing storm windows will pay for itself in about seven years and thereafter return an annual dividend of 13 percent.

Insulating glass (two panes of glass sealed together at the edges) has approximately the same effect as storm windows and storm doors. Triple glazing (insulating glass plus storm windows) is even more effective and often used in extremely cold climates.

Weatherstripping any door

between a heated space and an unheated one can be installed by a person of average do-it-yourself capability and should be considered when weatherizing a home.
