forages is one of the most important things in the feeding program. Growers should now be planning what kind of forage crops they hope to produce this year.

Both hay, silage, and pastures crops respond to good management. Growers who make a special effort to get maximum yields of quality forages usually do get more than the average.

As an example, some of the top growers in the 1979 Alfalfa Growing Contest got 7 tons of alfalfa per acre. This did not just happen. They planned and made do the same with hay crops, corn for silage, and for grazing land. Doing all of the practices that you know and doing them on time, will often get encourageing results.

To Market Those Fat Cattle The beef cattle market is a bit discouraging to many local feeders. Prices have not responded to increased costs.

This is especially true of heavy over-finished cattle.

I realize it is difficult to sell a string of finished cattle when the market is not suitable. However, to keep them on feed means higher cost of grain and less price per pound when marketed, in most instances. It might be good planning to be cutting out the heavier cattle each week and sell them rather than to hold the entire string, hoping for a price advance.

The continued feeding of finished cattle is just "poor business" at this time.
