GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. Cattle receipts this week: 3700, last week. 4100, year ago. 5400.

Compared with last week's close, slaughter steers and heifers .50-1.00 higher. Cows steady to 2.00 higher. Bulls weak to 2.00 lower. Receipts about 65 percent slaughter steers, 25 per cent slaughter heifers, balance mainly cows. Slaughter steers and heifers worked higher this week mainly due primarily to a higher dressed trade coupled with reduced receipts locally.

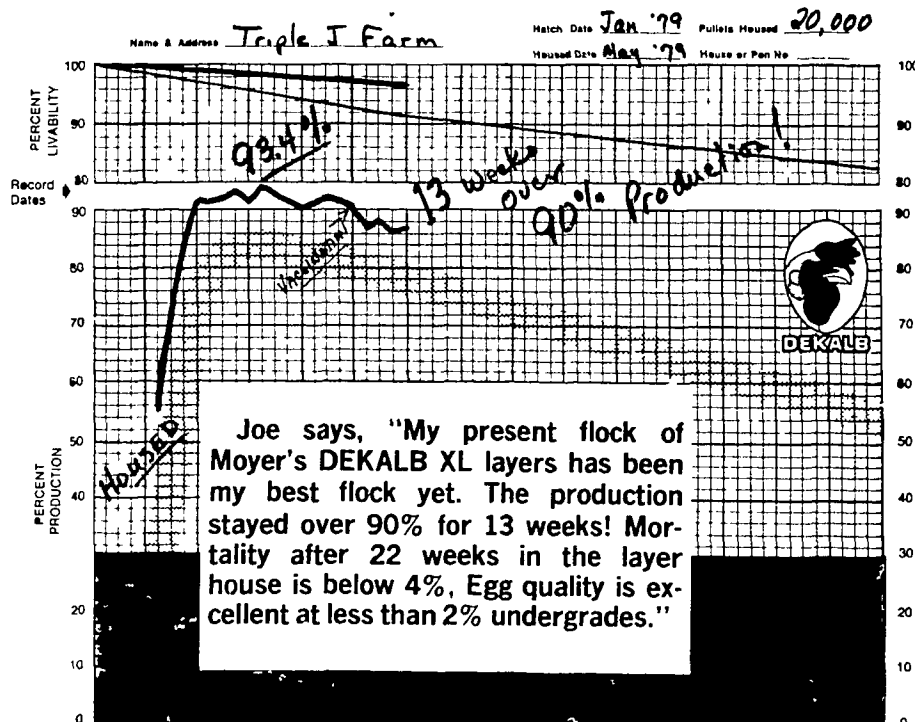
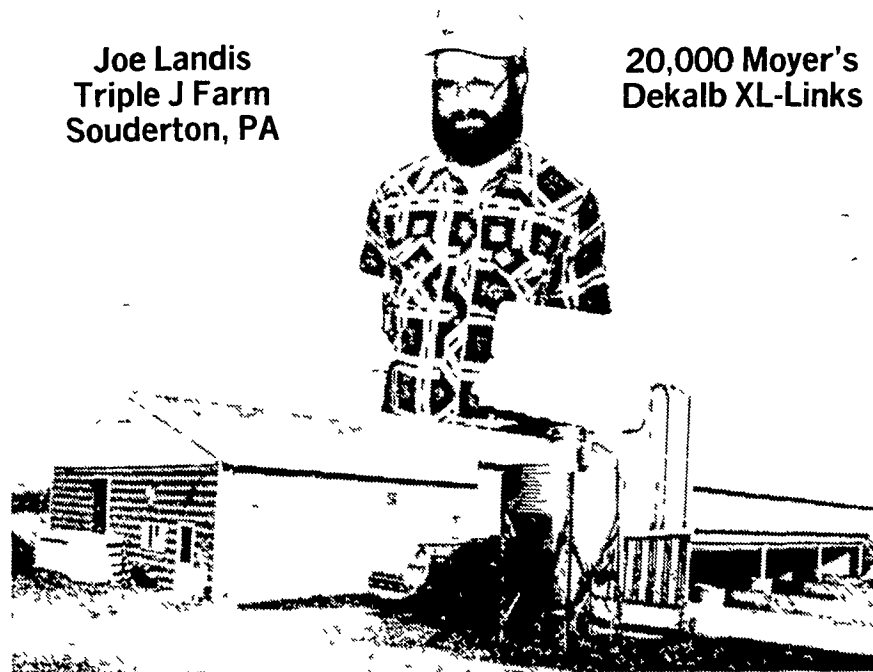
