The fed cattle trade again followed an irregular pattern characterized by wide day-to-day fluctuations. Prices advanced sharply in an aggressive trade Monday, lost part of the upturn on an expanded Tuesday run 52.00; Canner and Lowand then stabilized at midweek. Supplies were trading period and contributed to the uneven trade.
