

Berks Equine Council elects directors

LEESPORT — At a recent meeting, the Berks County Equine Council, under the direction of Clyde A. B. Myers, County Agent, took one more step towards its formation by electing a Board of Directors.

Those elected to the five

member Board were: Irv Evans, Reading, as President; Mike Kutzmonich, Barto, as Secretary; Luther Eichelberger, Boyertown, as Treasurer; Penny Heist, Sinking Springs, and Dorothy Swavely of Barto.

Myers will represent the county extension as a ex-officio member of the Executive Board.

The purpose of the Council is to promote equine activities in Berks County by informing and educating the

public about equine activities, to participate in State and County equine programs and to coordinate program with other equine groups in the State.

One of the projects the Council is undertaking is to work with other equine groups to host the 1980 Horse Expo being held at the Penn State University, Berks Campus on Saturday, March 22, 1980.

Proceeds of the Expo will be donated to the Berks County 4-H Center Equine facilities.

Other projects include the establishment of a County Equine Phone Directory and establishment of trails in the Blue Marsh Dam area.

Membership is open to individuals, clubs or business with horse interest who reside or conduct activities in Berks County.

Berks Farmers' Association passes membership goal

BLANDON — Jack Kooker, president of Berks County Farmers' Association, announced recently that the county membership goal has been surpassed, reaching a new record family membership of 1135. The previous record of 1073 memberships was 62 members less than the new level.

Kooker said the Berks County Farmers' Association is a general farm organization affiliated with the Pennsylvania Farmers Association. One of it's many functions is lobbying for legislation in the interests of the rural community, Kooker said.

A victory party is being planned to honor the co-chairmen of the membership drive, Harry Shaak, Hamburg, and Jeff Miller, Kutztown, and all membership workers.

Also to be recognized are the many farm families hosting the approximately 9500 visitors turning out for

farm-city week this past autumn.

Kooker accredited the significant increase in county membership to the diligent efforts of the membership committee and perhaps more importantly,

because more farmers despite decreasing numbers, are becoming more concerned with the quality of their products and their marketing price. Especially as it is effected by government legislation and regulation.

All interested persons are invited to attend the Pesticide Recertification Meeting to be held on Wednesday evening, February 20, at 7:30 p.m. in the Union Grove School.
