Classifying and becoming more fully aware of the functional traits each cow possesses; Liberal culling—removing from herd those cows who cannot keep pace with total herd; Total Performance Index—use in selecting good bulls; Regular purchasing of good quality females adding good and new blood to herd and; Awareness and development of good health and nutrition throughout the herd.

Nichols closed by saying registration certificates are playing a more active role in the Holstein breed.

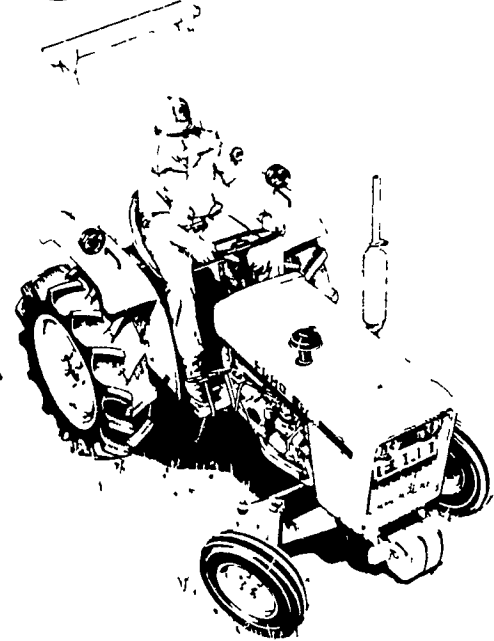

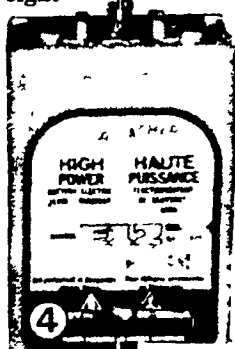

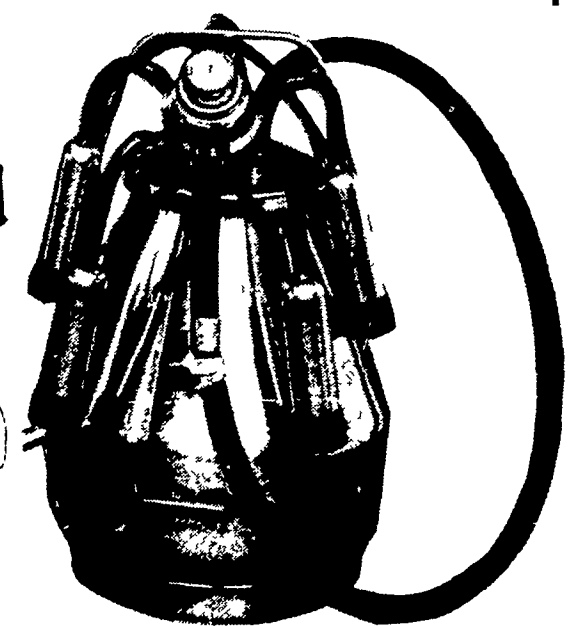
