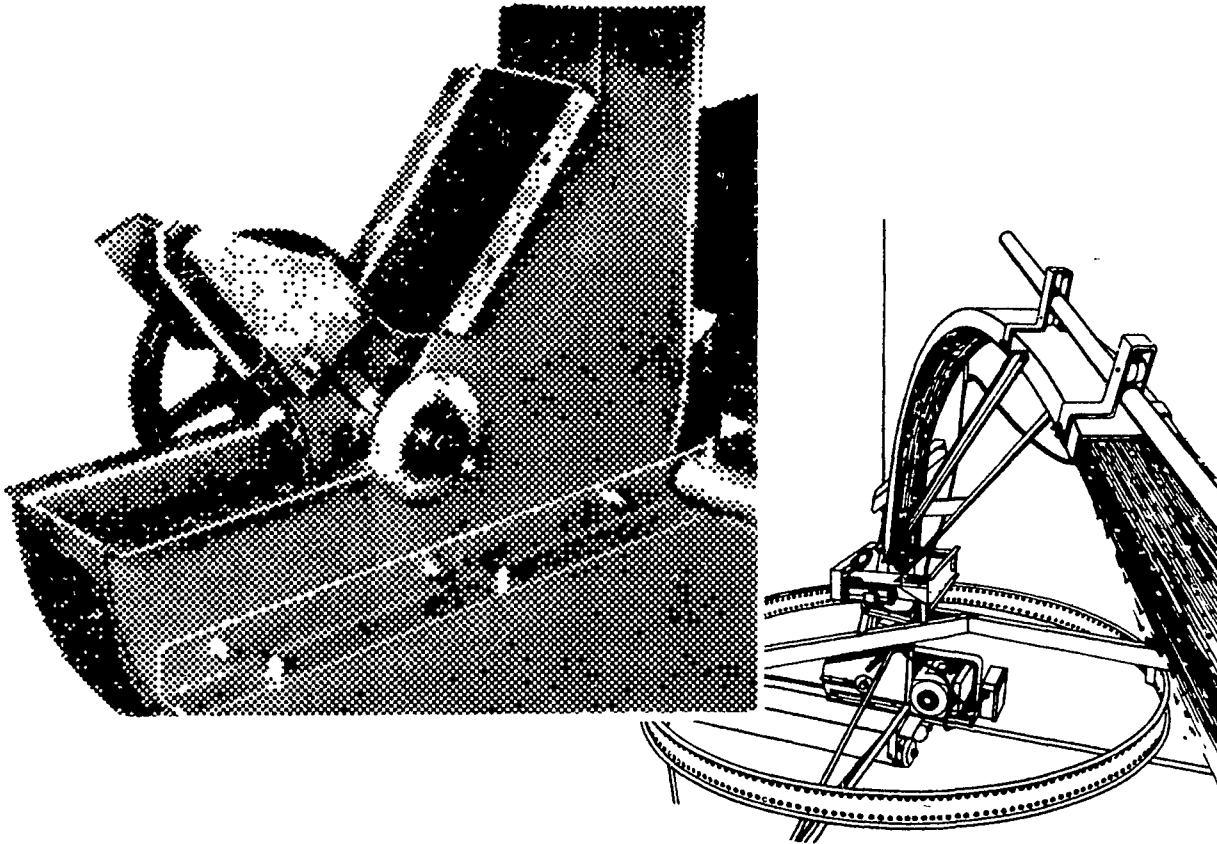

Swine breeding subject of adult farmer meeting

TERRE HILL — The Adult Farmer Programs of the Eastern Lancaster County School District are sponsoring a Swine Breeding Herd Management meeting on Tuesday evening, March 4, 1980, at 7:30 p.m. at the Union Grove School.

The speaker for the meeting will be Dr. John Hurtgen, Veterinarian from the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center, where he is the swine reproduction specialist.

Dr. Hurtgen recently spoke at the Keystone Pork Congress on managing replacement gilts.

He will be talking on sow, gilt, and boar selection, and breeding herd management. One half of the program will be devoted to a question and answer period.

Dr. Hurtgen comes to Pennsylvania from the midwest where he has done extensive work with breeding herds in confinement type housing. His presentation will include "down-to-earth practical information" every breeder can use.
