Local driving horses, 600-1200.





Shots are a pain in the ...! A reader asks:


I've heard that if you give injections to young livestock in their rumps, it can affect their development of the muscles in their hind-quarters. Where should intermuscular shots be given, rump or neck?

Dr. Riegel comments:

It's possible that intermusular injections given in the rump area of young livestock can affect muscular development.

This is especially true if the substance being injected is very irritating, and is injected near major nerves in the hind leg.

This is a definite consideration when dealing with purebred show stock, where conformation of the hindquarters is of great importance.



The rump area is, in most


So when dealing with large

numbers of cattle that are not being considered for livestock show prospects, the rump area will be used for most intermuscular injections with little or no side effects.


