


INDIANAPOLIS — Tractor pullers from Lancaster and Chester counties competed against the nation's top drivers recently at the seventh annual World Series of tractor pulling, the Indy Super Pull.

Competing from Lancaster County were Tony and Harold Stauffer, of New Holland. Driving his "Sneeki-Pete"

tractor, Tony Stauffer finished second in the 7000lb. super stock class. He has been competing for six years. Harold Stauffer finished 13th in the 9000-lb. super stock class and 20th in the 7000-lb. super stock event. Chester County competitors included Dale Smoker, of Cochranville, and Harry Greist, of Coatesville. Smoker finished 15th in the 5000-lb. super stock class, while Greist captured 17th in the 12,000lb. unlimited class and 19th in the 12,000-lb. super stock class.

In the Indianapolis pull, they competed against more than 100 other National Puller Association champions for prizes in the richest purse in tractor pulling. Attending the first major

pull of the 1980 season held in the Indianapolis Coliseum

was a large number of fans from across the country.


Sneeki-Pete tugs its way down the track of the first major tractor pull of the


year, the Indy Super Pull, with Tony Stauffer, of New Holand, at the wheel.
