

The fed cattle trade was characterized by a general atmosphere of caution, as slow carcass trading at the wholesale level provided little stimulation * Live prices were forced downward on a rather liberal Monday run and recovered little of the downturn in later trading; an uneven midweek trade closed out on a bearish note The overall finish of the steer and heifer supply was not particularly attractive with a large share Good to Average-Choice Feedlot conditions worsened over the weekend as temperatures climbed, and the mud was a prevalent factor Many cattle carrying a sizable amount of mud sold 1.00-1.50 below those of same grade which were relatively clean Slaughter steers made up approximately 49 pct and heifers 34 pct Cows comprised 9 pct and Feeders 7 pct.
