## Leaner year predicted at meeting

WYSOX — "Farmers may have a leaner year finan-cially in 1980," predicted Robert Reick, general manager at the Lewisburg office of the Production Credit and Federal Land Bank Associations.

Reick, the main speaker at the annual meeting of the Northeastern Farm Credit Service in Wysox, told the 150 farmer members present that higher costs of energy, chemicals, interest rates, etc. would be a continuing challenge to their management skills.


The meeting was climaxed by the entertainment of Art "Mr. Bones" Richards who played his ebony "bones" accompanied by music amplified from a tape recorder.
