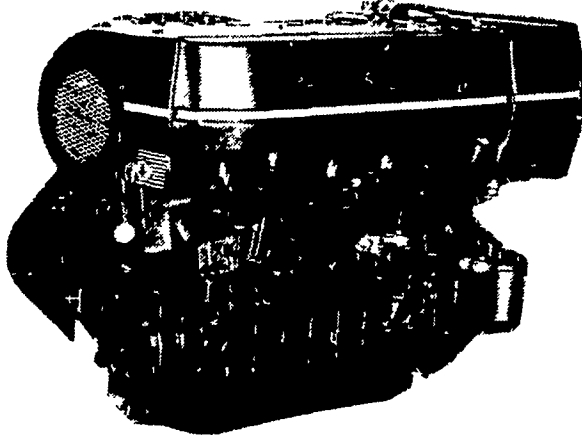


Oil Cooled Jacket

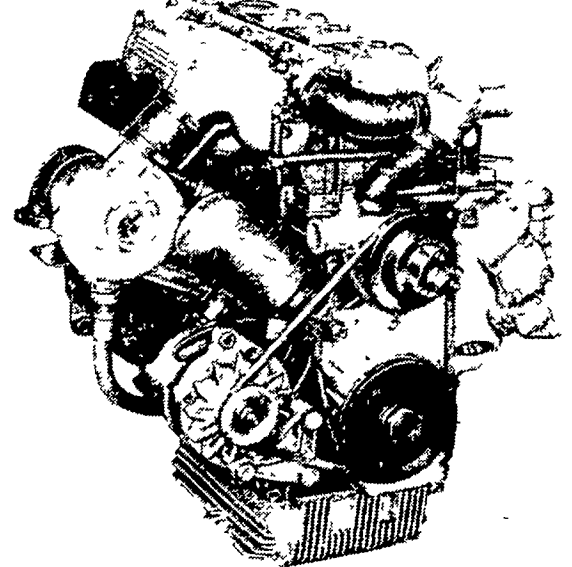
