Ask the Old Farmer: What is the meaning of the expression "getting a jim over the Johnson bar"? This was used commonly in the late 1920s and early '30s around Spokane, Wash, mostly among railroad and lumber workers OP Seal Beach Calif

Had the same meaning as 'getting the show on the road' The throttle on a steam locomotive was called the Johnson bar, when the train was stopped it was straight up and down on the quadrant To start the engine and take the slack out of the cars the throttle was pushed down the quadrant to the stop pin As the slack was taken out, the throttle was gradually drawn back to running position Home Hints: Keep ants out by putting talcum powder along their favorite
