tinued increases in You were warned the last production you couldn't two months that your expect any change in Class product prices-butter, prices before April 1 when powder and cheese- were the new support price would be announced.

Even your blend price was

exactly the same at \$12.25 for December and January.

Well, now you're getting more of the same in the Minnesota-Wisconsin price for February which was \$11.35 for 3.5 test milk. That's two cents less than January and one cent better than December.

This \$11.35 is your Basic Formula Price that determines the Class I and II prices that handlers will

For February, the Class I price will be seven cents better than January but the Class II price will be three cents less.

With increasing produc-

tion, your Class I utilization has been dropping from 51.2 in November to 47.8 in December to 47.1 in January. If that continues you can expect five to ten cents less on your blend price for February.

After that, the Louisville Plan deductions start in March and the new price supports starts in April. But don't look for milk prices this Spring that are high enough to cover all your cost increases of the past year.

Some indication of the milk supply situation came with the announcement the third week of February that over 120 producers in the
