My cow's got the winter blues! A reader asks:

We were recently advised in our breeder's association newsletter to keep an eye out for winter dysentary in our cattle That task is difficult to do when you don't know what the symptoms are. Could you please discuss this ' disease, its symptoms, causes, and cure?

Dr. Riegel comments:

Winter dysentary is a disease of cattle that gets its name because it is seen during the colder months of the year, October through Aprıl.

The disease is characterized by a brown, watery diarrhea which may contain flecks of blood The cattle appear normal in all other respects, including appetite, except for more active intestinal sounds and a drop in milk production.



older cattle more severely You will be noticing rough hair coats, sunken eyes, and other signs of dehydration in these animals


For many years the cause of the disease was thought to be an organism known as Vibro jejuni But due to its rapid spread, a virus is now thought to be the causative agent

The disease will generally run its course in three to four days In many cases, no

treatment is needed But in more severe cases, boluses to stop diarrhea and fluids to help combat dehydration are necessary

Winter dysentary can be confused with another disease — coccidiosis Your veterinarian can differentiate between the two by examining a manure sample under the microscope


