so you look at the color of the inside of the lamb's flank. It should be bright pink.

As in cattle and hogs, as an animal becomes older, the meat tends to become darker. So, if the flank appears dark red, it is a good indication that the animal is tending toward mutton-age.

In lamb as in beef, the amount of marbling in the

muscle is a quality factor to consider. In a ribbed carcass, all you have to do is look for specks of fat in the muscle. If, however, the carcass has not been cut, one of the best places to gauge whether the lamb will have adequate marbling is to look on the inside of the ribs.

Between the ribs, the muscle will appear to have

white feathers painted diagonally across the pink meat. These feathers are actually lines of fat between the ribs. The more feathers—the more marbling as a general rule of thumb.

Unlike the emphasis placed on marbling in beef in order for the meat to be top quality, the NLMB states marbling may have only a limited role as a taste-improver in lamb. What would be considered as traces of marbling in beef, is felt to be enough in lamb, according to the meat experts.

Age in lambs plays an important role in the way they are graded by USDA. Their standard for a carcass to be graded as a lamb depend on the animal's bones. If it is young, the bones in the leg will show pearly, smooth white cartilage when the joint is exposed.

Once the lamb reaches its first birthday, and some up to 14 months, the bones in the leg have finished growing and have ossified and become hard, porous, and brittle.

According to NLMB and the USDA, the younger the lamb, the milder the meat's flavor and the more tender the chops and cuts.

The USDA grading standards determine the classes of ovine meat by three age groups, lamb, yearling mutton and mutton. These classes are used without discrimination between sexes unless the carcass shows the heavy neck and shoulders associated with a ram. In that case, the carcass is graded down depending on the extent of development.

The quality grades of young ovine carcasses are prime, choice and good, depending on muscling and marbling. The mature classes also have these same three grades, but the standards are lower for marbling with a greater tolerance for more finish.

Yield grades in lamb and mutton classes are standards for judging the cutability or amount of meat on the carcass. There are five yield grades numbered 1 through 5, with one being the best.

As external finish on the lamb carcasses increase, the yield grade is lowered. The more wasty fat the carcass carries, the smaller the yield of lean meat after the fat is trimmed away.

Now that you've learned the reasons why lambs and mutton are graded for quality and yield, don't chuck the leg of lamb you've got waiting in the refrigerator if it's not perfect. But, keep the facts in mind on your next trip to the butcher shop so that your dollars will buy the best.
