At present, corn prices have dropped 30 cents per bu. and soybeans, \$1.10 per bu. Farmers don't have the money to pay back last year's production loans or for planting this year's crop. In addition, the President's latest call for higher interest rates and tighter credit con-

trols is putting farmers into an impossible situation.

Farmers just cannot survive in the face of plummeting farm prices particularly at a time when money is needed for this year's planting season. The President has also ordered Secretary of Agriculture Bergland to limit farm credit by raising farm credit rates and has threatened to veto an on-farm storage facility loan program because the interest rate is not high enough.

Andersen said the American people better prepare themselves for a change in their diet because farmers will not be able to produce what they can't afford to plant or feed.




