Del. soybean board to draft checkoff

DOVER, Del. — During the April meeting of the Delaware Soybean Board, Joe Hughes was selected to serve as chairman and Clark Calloway as Vice-chairman of the Board.

The first business of the Board was to draw lots determining the length of each member's term. Receiving one-year terms were: Henry Retz, Middletown; Clark Calloway, Bridgeville and Robert E. Dukes, Laurel. Those receiving two-year terms were: Joe Hughes, Felton; C. Wesley Webb, Goldsboro and William Vanderwende, Bridgeville.

Three-year terms were drawn by: William Cross, Middletown; Olin Gooden, Woodside and John Hastings, Laurel. The Delaware Soybean

Board will be drafting a soybean development order during April. The soybean development order is the basis of establishing a self-help program managed by soybean producers. Through a check-off, funds can be collected to assist such functions as education, research, production and market development relating to soybeans.

Soybean producers are encouraged to participate in the drafting of the development order by contacting their Board members during April. After the preliminary order has been drafted, a series of public hearings will be held to encourage further producer participation.

Following the hearings a referendum will be held on the final development order.

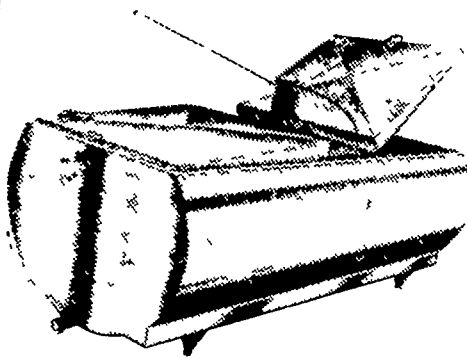
