MICE applications available in Maryland

BALTIMORE — In preparation for the third annual Maryland Institute of Cooperative Education or MICE as it has been more popularly labeled, some 300 applications have been distributed to 4-H agents, vocational agriculture teachers and cooperative youth committees throughout the state. Scheduled for June 10-12, the conference again will be held at Summit Lake Camp in the Catoctin Mountains near Emmittsburg.

The conference was created in 1978 as an educational forum for Maryland high school and college youth 16 to 21 years of age. It was designed as a workshop and idea exchange center with particular emphasis on cooperative theory and operation.

The program provides an opportunity for the cooperatives of Maryland and the Maryland Council of Farmer Cooperatives to educate agriculturally oriented youth on the value and strong points of the cooperative way of doing business. Stimulating discussions on the present problems and future

challenges which face farmers and their cooperatives often take place. Leadership development is also stressed during the two-day event.

Each year delegates to MICE are selected to represent the state's delegation at the American Institute of Cooperation's National Institute of Cooperative Education.

Youth delegates to the Maryland conference will be selected from written applications on the basis of leadership, achievement and ambition as well as their interest in cooperatives, agriculture and agribusiness.

Jack M. Gay, Farm Credit Banks, Baltimore, and chairman of the 1980 MICE Planning Committee said, "The 4-H agents, vo-ag teachers and cooperative leaders in the state are asked to make applications and information available to outstanding youth interested in agricultural cooperative education." He continued that youth may also nominate themselves for consideration by submitting an application.

Forms must be submitted to Chairman Jack Gay postmarked no later than May 1, 1980. Additional applications may be obtained from Robert J. Beiter, Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics, University of Maryland, College Park, Maryland 20742.

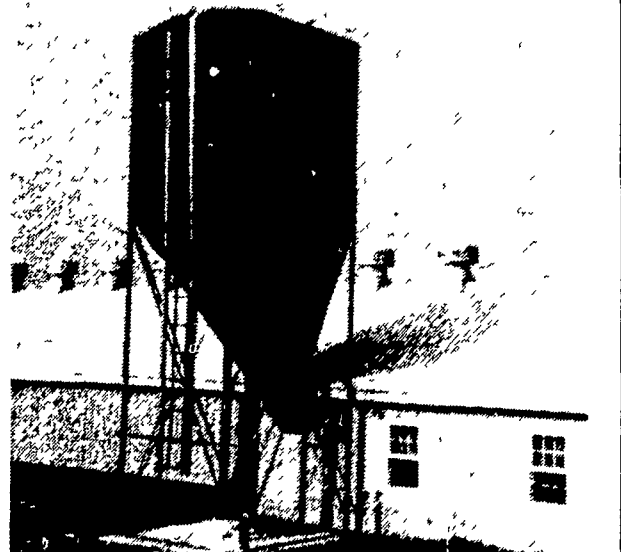

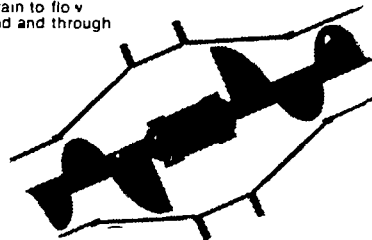
