GETTYSBURG — Four members of The Pennsylvania Farmer's Association office staff formed a panel to discuss PFA Services at the Adams County Farmers' Association Ladies' Spring Fling at the Sheraton Tuesday.

Moderator for the panel was David Muzzy, Regional Organization Director for nine counties in the surrounding area.

Jan Carson spoke on the Pennsylvania Agricultural Employment Division regulations.

Charles Clingan talked on County Advisory Councils. Many more councils are needed in Adams County. This is where policies begin, Clingan told the 100 farmers present.

"You certainly have neighbors you like to be with. Invite them to your home some evening for coffee and cookies and discuss current issues, local, State or National. If you need help call on John R. and Virginia Pitzer, Aspers. They will help you get started. The policies you make will be forwarded to the county and eventually to the state for approval or disapproval," he said.

Charles Dull talked on the Pennsylvania products that are for sale to the public and to members through Robel Acres, New Oxford, and Phil and Linda Pitzer at Aspers. He also mentioned that Penn Best products are available from Certified Farm Markets in Adams County. They are Kane Brothers on

Route 30 West; Worley's Nursery, and Weiser's Market at the Harrisburg Road; Crestmont Orchards and Peters Fruit Market in the upper Adams Area.

Marlin Miller spoke on the drive for financing the Pennsylvania Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Association. He emphasized that farmers must do more to market their products. He also said the deadline for PACMA's Fund drive is April 30. Shares of stock are being sold to raise 300,000 dollars for self financing.
