To be eligible, contestants must be the daughter of a dairy farmer, a dairy farm manager, herdsman or dairy farm owner during this year or must own more than one

dairy animal prior to May 1, 1980. Girls must have completed their junior year of high school and not reach their 22nd birthday by December 31, 1980. Contestants must be single, and never married and cannot marry during her reign.

According to Barbara Stauffer, Lancaster County's winner will receive a wardrobe and will participate in the state training seminar in July. She will represent Lancaster County at the Dairy Princess contest in September. All contestants will receive valuable gifts and make lasting friendships.

Contestants will have the opportunity to promote the dairy industry during activities of the contest.

Barbara encouraged all

eligible girls to enter and pointed out that high school seniors as well as college students can fulfill their responsibilities to the dairy industry. She stressed the opportunity for personal growth through sessions on poise and make-up.

The county winner will participate in the state Dairy Princess contest, and if

selected, will win \$300. The first and second runner-up also receive cash prizes. The state title is honorary and requires no interruption of school or regular employment plans.

Last year in New Jersey more than 23,000 youth participated in an animal care program.

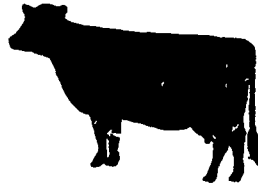
