Grasslands FFA chapter from Eastern Lancaster County High School won in the team competition of parliamentary procedure. "I am extremely impressed with the quality of the speaking and of the manuscripts, and the confidence with which the contestants spoke," said Arnold Hillman, superintendent of the Kutztown Area Schools, a judge in the public speaking competition. James Shadle, principal of the Blue Mountain Middle School, was a judge in the same competition.

In her presentation, Miller compared the challenge of farming to that of mountain climbing.

"As the mountain climber begins his upward journey, his mind is full of doubt and anxiety," she said.

But above him, urging him along, are three other climbers, Encouragement, Companionship, and Satisfaction. Each one gives of itself to help the climber reach his goal.

"Encouragement is a strong moving character who reminds the climber of what lies at the top of the mountain...Companionship

is there to guide the climber and to make him see that he is not alone...Satisfaction waits at the top of the mountain for the climber and shows him just what it is that he has done."

Second and third place awards went to Douglas Hershberger, Solanco High School, Lancaster County with his talk entitled "Cry of the American Farm Boy," and Steve Imes, Oley, with "Food for Fuel."

Second place in the extemporaneous competition was won by James Tretter, Lehigh, with "FFA Tells the Story." Third place went to Bruce Latschaw, Kutztown, with "Our Roots in the Soil."

Judges in the extemporaneous category

were Christopher Hering, language arts teacher at Kutztown High School and Herb Wetzel, associate county agent in Berks County.

Second and third place in the conservation competition went to Steve Kearns, Twin Valley, Berks County, speaking on "Integrated Pest Management," and Teresa C. Fink, Lehigh County, with her presentation titled "Will We Always Be Land of Plenty?"

That competition was judged by Marshall Haws, executive assistant of the Chester County Conservation District; Duane Pysher, district conservationist from Berks

County; and John Schueller, a field representative from the Pennsylvania Soil and Water Conservation Commission.

Nine chapters competed in the parliamentary procedure contest which was held in the adjacent Lehigh County Vo-Tech School.

Northern Lebanon and Annville Cleona chapters placed second and third.

Charles Lebo and Dale Davis of the Pennsylvania Department of Education and Boyd Gartley of Interstate Milk Producers' Cooperative, were judges.

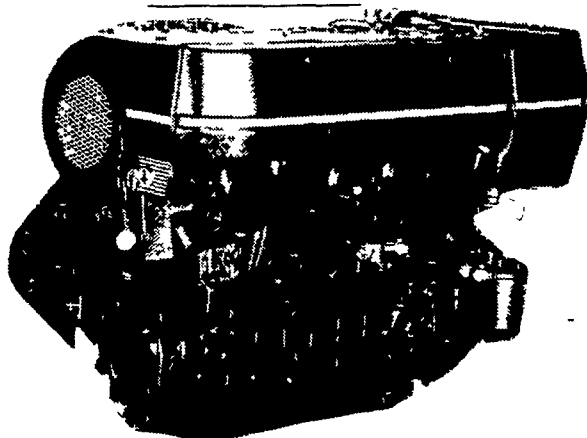


Oil Cooled Jacket

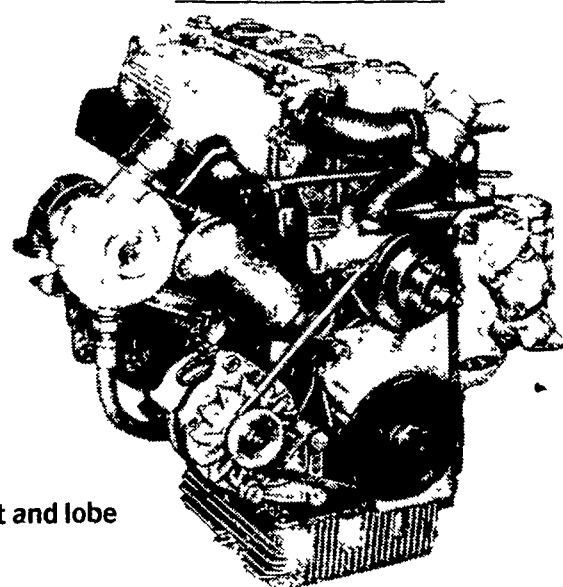
