DIABETIC OATMEAL COOKIES

11/2 cups fork-starred, all purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking powder

½ teaspoon salt

⅔ cup margarine

1½ cups quick cooking oats

½ cup sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

4 egg whites

½ cup skim milk

½ cup raisins

½ cup chopped (medium fine) nuts

On waxed paper, stir together the flour, baking powder and salt. In a medium saucepan over low heat, melt the margarine. Turn off the heat and stir in the oats, sugar and vanilla.

In a small bowl beat the egg whites, only until frothy, stir into the oats mixture. Stir in the flour mixture in 3 additions, alternating with the milk, just until blended.

Drop by level tablespoonfuls a few inches apart, onto lightly greased cookie sheets. Bake at 375° F. until lightly browned on bottoms or 10-12 minutes. Yields approximately 4 dozen cookies. because the wilderness action prohibits all motorized vehicles.

Another concern expressed to the group came from the Indian bus dirver who attends a university in Washington during the school year and drives tour buses during the Summer. She explained that the Indian custom holds that the children belong to the mother, that uncles teach their nephews to hunt and fish and that women pass on the history and stories from generation to generation by word of mouth. In addition to the historical perspective of material responsibility being heavy, the institution of welfare for the Indians and Eskimos has worsened the father's and husband's status. The trend as the bus driver experienced it in her community was toward less and less responsibility falling upon the male.

With 94 per cent of the land being owned by the United States Government, private individuals have very little area available to own or build upon Dorothy said. The cost of a house worth \$65,000 in the contiguous United States may be as high as \$400,000 in Alaska, Dorothy explained. Alaska is a beautiful state Dorothy agreed.
