schools which did not participate in the original program. These courses are designed to certify state energy auditors to complete the energy audit forms as a first step for any facility which wants to participate in the institutional building grants program.

It is open to local governments and schools from Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Mifflin, Perry, Snyder and York Counties.

To be eligible for the grants program, these institutions must either have licensed architects and engineers complete an energy audit 'building profile' or participate in one of the regional workshops.

A 'building profile' indicates recommended operating and maintenance procedures for conserving energy in a particular structure. Completed profiles will be used to select those institutions which will receive 50 percent federal matching funds for completeing a detailed engineering analysis.


Thanks for the kindness you expressed in doing such a good job on my questions and also for sending me the writeup from Lancaster Farming's Sheila's Shorts column.
