## Berks sheep clinic coming

LEESPORT — The Berks County Cooperative Extension Service will hold a sheep skills clinic on June 14, starting at 9 a.m. at the Leesport Market and Auction.

This clinic will help shepherds who are relatively new in the sheep business or who are just getting started, learn some basic management practices.

Six basic sheep management skills will be taught. The proper techniques will be discussed and demonstrated for the following practices: catching sheep; making an instant halter; determining the age of sheep by examining their teeth; deworming sheep with a dose syringe; determining rectal temperature; and

giving an intramuscular injection.

The clinic will be taught by Clyde A. B. Myers, County Agent. Cost will be \$5.00 and all equipment will be provided.

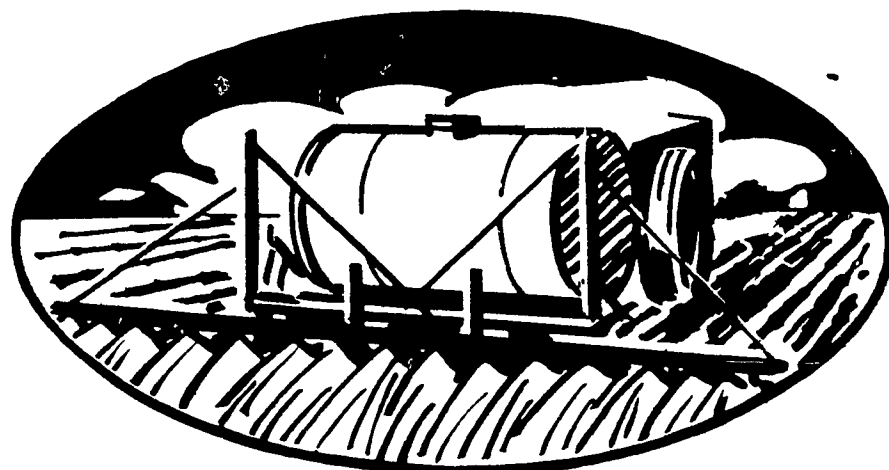

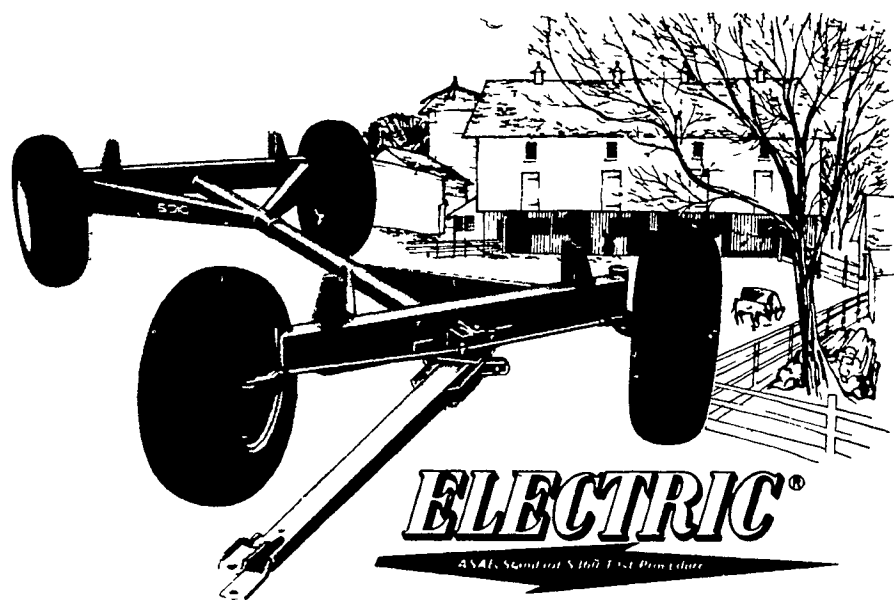
