Farm donated for 4-H center

HOWARD COUNTY, Md. - A \$200,000 gift to the Maryland 4-H Club Foundation will become a perpetual memorial to a former Howard County resident.

The gift, a 135-acre farm in Western Howard County, will be the future site of a Maryland 4-H conference center.

William W. Blaisdell, Cheverly, Md., presented the deed, representing 118 years of family ownership, to James Moxley, president of the Maryland 4-H Foun-

dation, in an informal ceremony on the lawn of Blaisdell's birthplace.

The property is located just off Interstate 70 at Old Baltimore and Frederick Road. Development rights have been legally transferred to the Maryland Environmental Trust.

Development of the 4-H conference center will begin in 1982 with construction of a cental conference facility.

The farm will be developed as an education center in memory of Mr.

Blaisdell's mother, Florence Arabella Crook Blaisdell, and "dedicated to the young people of Maryland, to foster their educational opportunities and to build their love of nature and life." Fiorence Blaisdell was a teacher and a long time Howard County resident. During the 15 years that she taught in the one-room Ridgley school, she rode the 11/2 miles to school on horseback. She spent another 15 years teaching in the public schools of New York City.
