LANCASTER — The top selling animal at the Second International Red & White Heifer Sale held at the Lancaster Guernsey Sales Pavilion was Artim Molly Chief Tammy-Red, which brought a high winning bid of \$4,400.

The seven-month-old heifer was consigned by B. Timothy Sturgeon, Fombell, Pa.; and was purchased by Blair Red Breeders, Martinsburg, Pa. The

purchasers include Harold and Russell Steele, Donald and Earl Stonerook, Donald and Alan Gearhart and J. Milton Cole and Sons.

She was sired by Vincent-View Molly Chief and her dam is a Very Good daughter of Performer, which has since scored excellent.

A total of 40 heifers were consigned at the sale sponsored by the Red and White Dairy Cattle

Association. The sale average was \$1,734, one of the highest recorded in the East.

The second high selling heifer was two-year-old Elleeta Citation Janice-Red at \$3,150. She was consigned by Willsey Farm, Belmont, Ontario, Canada; and bought by LaVerne G. Moser, New Berlinville, Pa.

The average sale price of 43 red and whites in the Herrvales Milking Herd

Dispersal, was \$1,833. The bred heifer average for the herd of Karl W. Herr, Kirkwood, was \$1,683; while the average for milking cows was \$1,844.

The top animal, Herrvales Jasper Irma-Red, was sold to Donald and Earl Stonerook, Martinsburg, for \$3,950. The second high animal, Herrvales Jasper Dana-Red, was purchased by James F. Myer, Lititz, for \$2,950.

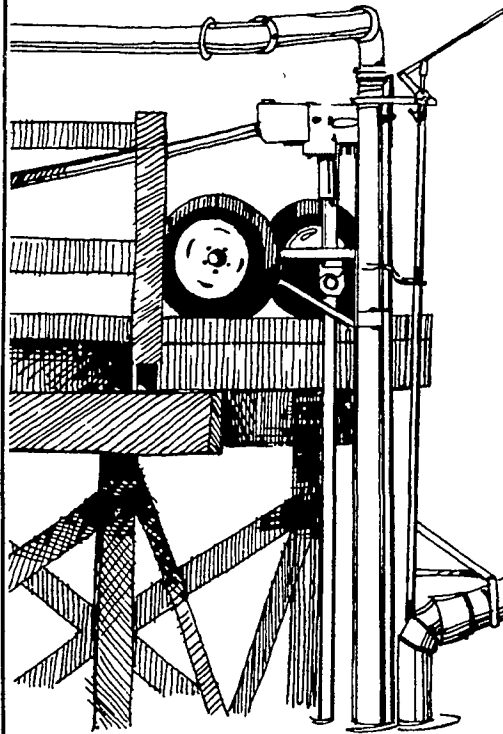
