

Six cited by Longwood for ornamental work

KENNETT SQUARE — Six people have received Fellowships for study in the Longwood Program in Ornamental Horticulture of the University of Delaware.

This graduate Program, in cooperation with the renowned Longwood Gardens in Kennett Square, seeks to train managers for botanic gardens, display gardens, arboreta and other public horticultural institutions around the country.

Students come from diverse backgrounds, but all are required to have a degree in horticulture or a

closely related discipline, or considerable experience working with plants and the public. All Fellows selected this year have worked in public horticulture.

Timothy Hohn, an extension agent in Georgia, is a graduate of Michigan State University and has an additional baccalaureate degree in communications from Western Michigan University. In addition, he has had nursery experience at a variety of levels in several parts of the country.

Robert Hyland, a horticulturist working in historical landscape

restoration at Old Salem Village in North Carolina, comes to the Program with an A.B. in botany and a master's degree in recreation horticulture, farming, and food service, as well as experience with arboretum collections.

Ray Kuipers, the first student to come to the Longwood Program from South Dakota, has an undergraduate degree in horticulture with a minor in economics. He has had experience in commercial horticulture, farming, and food service, as well as experience with arboretum collections.

Susan Lathrop, at present an intern working with the education department at Morris Arboretum in Philadelphia, has worked

with the care of plant collections as well as in landscape design and in language training. She has undergraduate degrees from Wellesley College and the University of Delaware, and graduate degrees from Wellesley and Smith College.

Charles Thomforde, a Swartmore graduate in biology, has held several internships at the Morris Arboretum and numerous private gardening positions.

Joseph Townsend graduated from Kenyon College in history and religion in 1971. Since that time he has trained with the Davey Tree Expert Company and served as a district manager in Hilo, Hawaii and San Francisco, California. More recently he has been a greenhouse manager for J. F. Styer in West Chester.

These Longwood Fellows will spend the next two years training at the University of Delaware and Longwood Gardens.

Exotic fuels, do they work?

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — Recent articles have extolled the merits of using vegetable oils, sunflower oil, or soybean oil in diesel engines.

Claims of equal or improved performance as compared to diesel fuel have been made about various oils. However, a flag of caution has been raised by agricultural engineers at Purdue University.

Engine oil samples from a new diesel tractor which had been burning a fuel mixture of 50 percent soybean oil and 50 percent diesel oil were examined. Globes of oxidized soybean oil were found.

Purdue University agricultural engineers report "all vegetable oils, including soybean oil, are very unstable compared to mineral oils. In other words,

they easily oxidize or form gums and varnish-like substances.

"This process of oxidizing is speeded up when exposed to heat. Just a small amount of unburned fuel (in this case, half soybean oil and half diesel fuel) leaking by the piston rings will quickly oxidize in the hot engine oil.

"This problem would be even worse in a new engine in which there is more blow-by, before it is broken in."

If you're going to use vegetable oils, including soybean or sunflower oil, Purdue University advises:

Use it only in a well broken in engine; change oil often, at least every 25 hours; and watch the oil pressure constantly.

Use it in gas turbine engine where lubrication oil and fuel cannot mix.
