

# Farm and Home Foundation awards scholarships

LANCASTER — Twenty young Lancaster countians were awarded scholarships of \$750 each by the Lancaster County Farm and Home Foundation at the regular meeting of their Board of Directors on Tuesday. Scholarships were awarded on the basis of financial need, scholarship and leadership and are for

the freshman year of college. Six agricultural scholarships were given, four home economists and ten nursing. Money for the scholarships, the largest number and the highest amount given since the program's inception, comes from a trust fund set up by late Elmer L. Esbenschade, one of the Foundation's early beneficiaries and from the

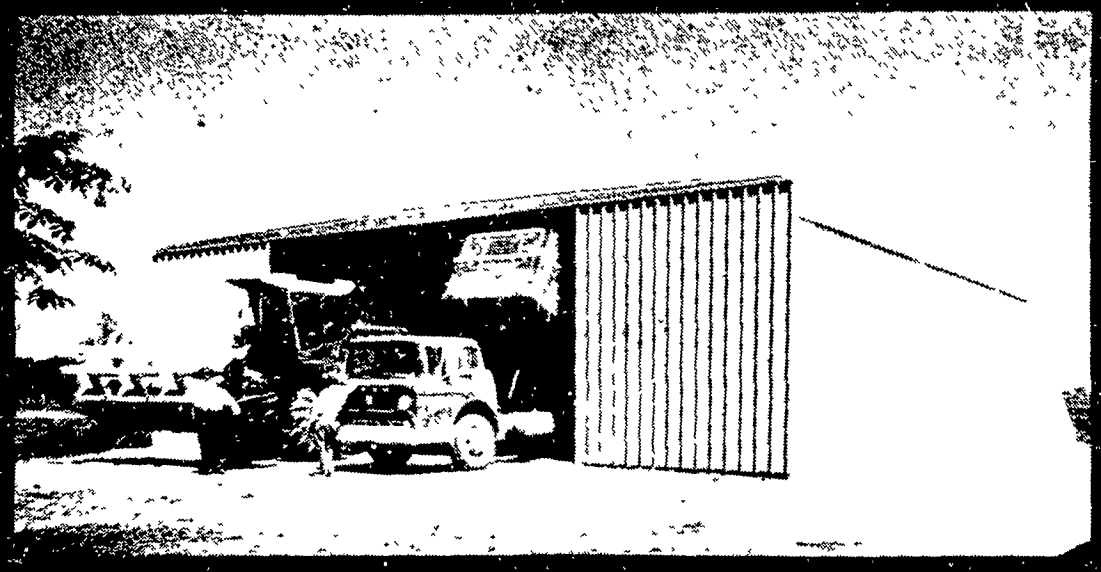

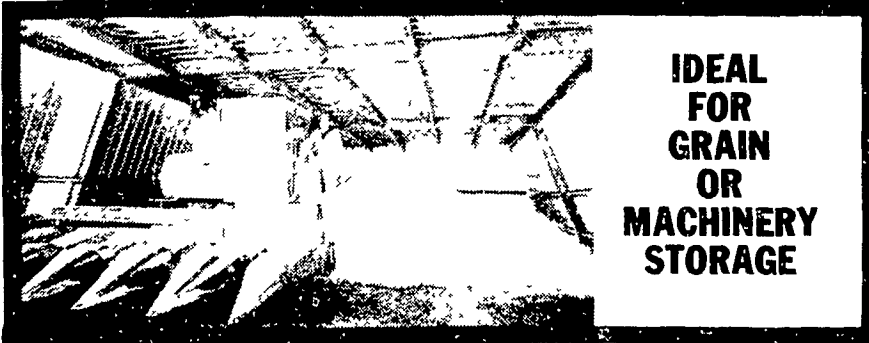
